#### **INTRODUCTION**

**Ahilya Bai College of Nursing,** Lok Nayak Hospital, Jawahar Lal Nehru Marg, New Delhi was established in July, 1993. B. Sc. (Hons.) Nursing Course of University of Delhi offered by the college extends over a period of four academic years, 8 semesters including Internship.

Lok Nayak hospital (formerly known as Irwin Hospital), Gobind Ballabh Pant post Graduate Institute of Medical Education and Research (GIPMER) and Guru Nanak Eye Centre with 2053, 791 & 212 beds respectively are the associated hospitals for imparting practical training to the students.

The purpose of the course is to assist the students to become a professional Nurse who is committed to the promotion of health, prevention of disease, care and rehabilitation of the clients. Nursing is concerned with individual, patient, family and community. The college provides opportunities for the student to integrate and utilize knowledge, understanding and skills from the various bio-psycho-social fields of learning necessary in the practice of nursing. The curriculum has been planned to provide breadth of knowledge to enable the programme to function effectively in varied nursing situations where the nurse will work as a member of health team for group of patients, families and community at various levels in urban as well as in rural areas.

   ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS/REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION TO B. Sc. (Hons.)
   NURSING COURSE FOR THE YEAR 2025-2026

#### 1. MINIMUM CONDITIONS OF ELIGIBILITY FOR REGISTRATION:

- i. **Age**: The Candidate should have completed the age of 17 years on or before 31<sup>st</sup> December 2025. The candidates completing the age of 17 years on 1<sup>st</sup> January 2026 or later will not be eligible. The upper age limit is 35 years as on 31/12/2025 further provided that this upper age limit is relaxed by a period of five years for the candidates belonging to SC/ST category.
- ii. **Qualifying Examination**: A candidate seeking admission to First year B. Sc. (Hons.) Nursing Course must have passed Senior School Certificate Examination conducted by CBSE/Council of the Indian School Certificate Examination (12years course) from a recognized school or an examination recognized as equivalent to, with 50% or more marks in the aggregate of 4 subjects

including English (Core/Elective), Physics, Chemistry and Biology, provided the student has passed in each subject separately.

- iii. Only women candidates are eligible for the course.
- iv. The criterion for deciding the region of the candidate for B. Sc. (Hons.) Nursing course 2025, (who have passed/appeared in the Senior School Certificate Examination or an examination recognized as equivalent to, through Patrachar/ Correspondence /Open School) will be the location of the school. The candidate must have got herself registered with any school for the purpose.

#### 2. BASIS OF SELECTION:

Admission for the B.Sc(Hons) Nursing Course for the year 2025-2026 is in process. In this regard it is informed that admission to B.Sc (Hons) Nursing Course would be through MCC Counselling. Information bulletin and other information related to admission will be published on college website www.abconlnhdu.com

Candidates are admitted to B.Sc (Hons) Nursing course on the basis of NEET (UG) exam 2025 and MCC counselling for the course.

#### 3. MEDICAL FITNESS:

A candidate must be medically fit for the course.

# ADMISSION OF THE CANDIDATE MAY BE CANCELLED ANY TIME IF APPLICANTS ARE FOUND INELIGIBLE OR IF APPLICATION FORM IS INCOMPLETE.

#### 4. TOTAL NUMBER OF SANCTIONED SEATS: 40 (Forty)

The total seats earmarked for the B.Sc. (Hons.) Nursing Course shall be allocated region-wise as follows:

- a. **Delhi Region (85%)** For students passing from School located in the Union Territory of Delhi. The student must have studied 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> class from a recognized school with in the national capital territory of Delhi.
- **b. Outside Delhi Region (15%)** For students passing from schools/Colleges and Institutions situated outside the National Capital Territory of Delhi.

#### Distribution of seats for the session 2025-26 is as given below:-

**Seat matrix calculation -** The Seats for EWS were calculated as per Delhi University letter No.Ref. N:Aca.I/EWSs/2019 dated 15-05-2019. Since the Seats were increased to 10% in 2019-20 academic year (First Phase), further 15% seats are enhanced in academic year 2020-21. Seat matrix calculated as given below:-

Total 25 % seats were enhanced in 2021-22 of sanctioned 40 seats=25 % of 40=10 Seats

- Total No. of Seats=40+10=50
- For the academic session 2025 to 2026 the total no of seats are 50
   Distribution of seats is given below:-
- A. Delhi (85%) :- 43 B. Outside Delhi (15%):- 07

Reservation for SC (15%), ST (7.5%), OBC (27%), and EWS (10%), PWD & CW will be according to MCC and Delhi University norms.

Seats may be deleted or added depending upon the status of approval from university/Indian Nursing council/ dept. of H&FW Govt. of Delhi.

#### **5. RESERVED CATEGORY:**

#### A. Provision for scheduled caste/scheduled tribe/OBC

- a) 22.5% of the total number of seats (15% for Scheduled caste and 7.5% seats for Scheduled tribe Category) are reserved for scheduled caste and scheduled tribe candidates. Each scheduled caste /scheduled tribe candidate who have passed the qualifying examination will be given 5% or further relaxation to the extent required in order to be registered for the B.Sc (Hons.)Nursing Course.
- b) Provided that if any seats reserved for candidates belonging to SC/ST categories remain vacant due to non availability of eligible candidates under that category the same will be filled in the following manner:
  - i. Such Vacant seats will be offered to the eligible candidates of the other category. i.e. the seats of SC category to ST category candidate and vice versa as the case may be.

- ii. If the seats remain vacant even after applying b (i) above, these Vacant seats reserved for SC/ST category if any, will be kept vacant.
- c) 27% seats are reserved for candidates belonging to OBC category. However, the OBC status is to be determined on the basis of the central list of OBC(s) notified by the ministry of social justice and Empowerment on the recommendation of the National Commission for backward classes available at their website (http://ncbc.nic.in/backward classes/intex.html).
- d) The OBC candidate should not belong to creamy layer. Non creamy layer certificate of the financial year 2025-2026 issued by one of the competent authorities as mentioned above shall be submitted at the time of admission. The OBC candidates who belong to the 'Non-Creamy Layer' and whose caste appears in the Central List of the OBCs only, shall be eligible to be considered for admission under the OBC category (Validity period of OBC certificate in respect of 'non-creamy layer' status of the cadidates as per DOPT Office Memorandum no. 36036/2/2013-Estt. (Res-I) dated 31 March 2016). The certificate should be issued after 31st march 2025.
- e) Provided that if any of the seats reserved for the candidates belonging to OBC category remain vacant due to non-availability of eligible candidates the same would be filled up from open merit list.
- f) The SC/ST/OBC/EWS candidate should attach a certificate to the effect that she belongs to SC/ST/OBC/EWS category from any one of the competent authority as listed below without which concession of reservation of seats for SC/ST/OBC/EWS will not be given:-
  - (i) District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate/Deputy Commissioner/Deputy Collector/First Class Stipendiary Magistrate/City magistrate (Not below the rank of First Class Stipendiary Magistrate)/Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Taluka magistrate/executive Magistrate/Extra Assistant Commissioner.
  - (ii) Chief Presidency magistrate/Additional Chief Presidency magistrate/Presidency Magistrate.
  - (iii) Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.
  - **(iv)** Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidate and/or her family normally resides.
  - **(v)** Administrator/Secretary to Administration Development Officer (Lakshadweep and Minicoy Island (For SC/ST/OBC).

# B. Provision for children/widows of armed personnel including Para military personnel killed or disabled during hostilities or who died on duty (CW).

a) The children/widows of the Officers and Men of the Armed forces including Para Military Personnel killed or disabled during hostilities as also who died on duty will be given concession of 5% marks in the minimum eligibility conditions as per rules of the University. 5% seats are reserved for the candidates belonging to armed forces and paramilitary personnel (CW) Category in order of preference given below:

**Priority I**: Widows/wards of Defense Personnel killed in action.

Priority II : Wards of serving personnel and ex-servicemen disabled in action.
 Priority III : Widows/wards of Defense Personnel who died in peace time with Death Attributable to Military Service.

**Priority IV**: Wards of Defense Personnel disabled in peace time with disability Attributable to Military Service.

Priority V: Wards of Ex-servicemen personnel and serving personnel including personnel of police forces who are in Receipt of Gallantry Awards (Param Vir Chakra, Ashok Chakra, Maha Vir Chakra, Kirti Chakra, Vir Chakra, Shaurya Chakra, President's Police Medal for Gallantry, Sena Medal (Gallantry) Nau Sena Medal (Gallantry) Vayu Sena Medal (Gallantry), Mention-in-Dispatches, Police Medal for Gallantry).

**Priority VI**: Wards of Ex-Serviceman

**Priority VII**: Wives of:

- I. Defense personnel disable in action and boarded out from service.
- II. Defense personnel disable in service and boarded out with disability attributable to military service.
- III. Ex-servicemen and serving personnel who are in receipt of Gallantry Awards.

Priority VIII: Wards of Serving PersonnelPriority IX: Wives of Serving personnel

- b) In order to become eligible for the above concession, the widows/children of officers and Men of the Armed Forces including Para Military personnel will be required to produce an Entitlement Certificate from any of the following authorities:
  - i. Secretary, Kendriya Sainik Board, Delhi
  - ii. Secretary, Rajya Zila Sainik Board
  - iii. Officer-in-charge Record Office

- iv. 1<sup>st</sup> class Stipendiary magistrate.
- v. Ministry of home affairs (for police personnel in receipt of gallantry award)
- c) In case eligible candidates from the categories mentioned above are not available, the vacancies will be treated as unreserved.

#### C. Provision for persons with disability (PWD):

There is a provision of 5% seats for persons with disability (disability of loco motor to the tune of 40% to 50% of the lower extremity). The candidate has to satisfy/fulfill the norms stipulated by the Indian Nursing Council (INC). However, candidates may kindly note that in case of selection under Persons with Disabilities (PWD) category, they will be required to produce Disability Certificate from one of the disability assessment boards/authorities before their scheduled date of counseling.

#### D. Economically weaker section (EWS)

10 % of the total no. of seats are reserved for the Economically Weaker section (EWS) as per the guidelines of Govt. of India.

#### 6. INSTRUCTIONS RELATED TO ADMISSION

- a. As per MCC counselling (refer MCC information bulletin for NEET-UG, (MBBS/BDS/B.Sc Nursing)2025-2026.
- **b.** NO INDIVIDUAL COMMUNICATION/OFFICE CORRESPONDENCE OR TELEPHONIC INFORMATION IN THIS REGARD WILL BE PROVIDED BY THE COLLEGE TO THE CANDIDATES.
- c. Bring original and an attested true copy of following academic and other certificates at the time of admission at Ahilya Bai College of Nursing.
  - i. Printout (hard copy) of the application form filled online for NEET (UG) Exam.
  - **ii.** Secondary School Leaving Certificate (S.S.L.C), Matriculation certificate indicating Date of Birth or Birth Certificate, if not entered in the S.S.L.C.
  - **iii.** S.S.C (10+2)/Equivalent Examination certificate (Provisional Certificate if original certificate is not received so far).
  - iv. S.S.C. (10+2)/Equivalent Examination Mark Sheet.
  - v. A Certificate indicating passing of Hindi (up to 8th Class).

- **vi.** Character Certificate from the Principal of School/College last attended/Gazetted officer. Character certificate should be latest, not older than 6 months.
- **vii.** Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/O.B.C./PWD/Military/Para military/EWS Certificate from a competent authority, if applicable.
- **viii.** Fee as given in prospectus.
  - ix. Ten recent passport size colored photographs.
  - **x.** Copy of NEET (UG) 2025 score card and provisional allotment letter from MCC.
  - xi. Admit card of NEET (UG)2025 Exam.
- d. Full form of Abbreviation used are as under:
  - (i) P.C.B.E: Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English.
  - (ii) PWD Person with disability
  - (iii) CW: Children/ widows of officers and men of the armed forces including Paramilitary personnel
  - **(iv)** EWS- Economically weaker section
- e. Candidates must have passed in all the required subjects, separately (in Theory & Practical) required for admission to B.Sc. (Hons.) Nursing Course
- f. Candidate who has appeared in the 12<sup>th</sup> class Annual Examination of the year 2025 and placed under compartment will not be eligible.
- g. Candidate who has appeared at the 12<sup>th</sup> class Annual Examination of the year 2025 and is reappearing for improvement will also be considered eligible as per the instructions/ guidelines issued.
- h. In case the information furnished or certificates etc. submitted are found to be false, or the candidate is found to have withheld or concealed any information in her application form, she shall be removed from the college rolls and fee deposited by her shall be forfeited.
- i. All admissions are provisional, subject to the verification of original documents and medical examination conducted by College/Hospital authorities respectively.
- j. The acceptance in writing and fee should be given in time according to dates mentioned in the admission schedule. If the candidate does not take admission by the date and time mentioned in the admission schedule, the seat will be offered to the next eligible candidate as per MCC counselling.
- k. Every student admitted to the college shall be required to sign a declaration that on admission she submits herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice-Chancellor and other authorities of the University and College, who may

be vested with the authority, the ordinances and rules that have been framed there under by the University/College. Failure by parents/guardians/students to acquaint themselves with the rules of the College and of the University of Delhi will not be entertained as a defense for breach of rules.

Note: Any Ambiguity/False Information/Concealment Of Information Detected In The Requisite Certificates Will Result In The Cancellation Of The Candidature Of The Candidate At Any Stage Of Selection And/Or During The Course Of Study.

#### 7. ADMISSION PROCEDURE:-

Candidates will be admitted to B.Sc (H) Nursing Course at Ahilya Bai College of Nursing through MCC Counselling .The admission procedure of the selected candidates will be according to MCC guidelines.

- a) The candidate should bring all the original certificates and their attested photocopy, copy of online filled application form, proof of NEET (UG) score 2025 (as mentioned in the point 6.c (i-xi) of other instructions) along with fee given in the bulletin of information of Ahilya Bai College of Nursing, failing to provide the requisite documents and fee, admission will be cancelled and the seat will be offered to next eligible candidate as per MCC counselling.
- b) The candidates who have been provisionally admitted in B.Sc. (H) Nursing Programme shall appear before a Medical Board on the dates given by the concerned College/Institution for medical examinations. The candidate shall not be allowed to join the course if she is found medically unfit for the course.
- c) The candidate will be issued seat allotment letter by hand after the completion of admission process.
- d) The candidates must report to the college on the date mentioned in their admission letter for completing the requirements for admission, failing which his/her admission is liable to be cancelled.
- It is the sole responsibility of the candidate to appear for MCC counselling for NEET-UG, (MBBS/BDS/B.Sc Nursing)2025-2026. and report to the allotted college (ABCON, LNH) as per the guidelines uploaded on the MCC website (mcc.nic.in) and college website (www.abconlnhdu.com)

#### 8. <u>ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR B.Sc (HONS) NURSING COURSE:</u>

A student needs to have 80% attendance in theory and 80% in practical to be eligible to appear in examination. However, 100% attendance in the

clinical field must be completed before the award of degree as per Indian Nursing Council guidelines and norms of University of Delhi.

#### 9. OTHER INFORMATION:

- a. The students are required to stay in the College Hostel. Joining the Mess in the Hostel is compulsory. Students can be day scholar with prior permission from authorities.
- b. The students are expected to follow the rules of the College, Hostel and Mess and failure to do so will lead to disciplinary action.
- c. Hostel accommodation will be available from the beginning of the session.
- d. Students are advised not to keep heavy cash, Gold / Silver Jewelry and costly items in their rooms.
- e. Students are required to buy text books for their course.
- f. The college provides transport facilities for the students' fieldwork. Whenever this is not feasible, the students will have to use Public Transport at their own expenses.
- g. Candidates selected for admission to B.Sc (Hons.) Nursing Course is required to make arrangement for purchasing the prescribed uniform for clinical/field experience.
- h. The College has its health service and infirmary available but serious illness is referred to Delhi Government Hospitals.
- i. Each student has to meet the expense towards replacement of any part of the tube light/bulb of her hostel room, if it goes out of order.
- j. Vacations will be given as per Delhi University norms.
- k. During fourth year (internship year), B.Sc. (Hons.) Nursing students will receive stipend as per government rules.
- l. Each student is entitled for 14 days leave in entire course duration. For each sanctioned leave taken by students, make up duties will be done in the ratio of 1:1. For each absentism from clinical duties, make up duties will be done of ratio of 1:3.
- m. Hundred percent completion of Clinical Field experience is mandatory for completion of course.

#### Note:-

- Mess charges are to be paid in advance by the 5<sup>th</sup> of every month. There is a late fee fine for all dues paid after 5<sup>th</sup> day of every month at the rate of Rs. 10/- per day. In case the last day for paying fees of any month happens to be a holiday or Sunday the fees should be paid the following day.
- The defaulter in payment of the fee of (any kind) on or before due date more than 4 weeks period, her or his name shall be deemed to be struck from the roll of the student of the college.

## **11.** MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE AMONG STUDENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY Ordinance XV-B:

- (i) All power relating to discipline and disciplinary action are vested in the Vice-Chancellor.
- (ii) The Vice-Chancellor may delegate all or such powers as he/she deems proper to the proctor and to such other persons as he/she may specify in this behalf.
- (iii) Without prejudice to the generality of power to enforce discipline under the ordinance, the following shall amount to act of gross indiscipline:
  - **(a)** Physical assault or threat to use physical force, against any member of the teaching and non-teaching staff of any Institution/Department and against any student within the University of Delhi.
  - **(b)** Carrying of 'use of' or threat of use any weapons.
  - **(**c) Any violation of the provision of the civil Rights Protection Act 1976.
  - **(d)** Violation of the status, dignity and honor of the students belonging to the scheduled caste/Scheduled Tribe.
  - **(e)** Any practice-whether verbal or otherwise-derogatory of women.
  - **(f)** Any attempt at bribing or corruption in any manner.
  - **(g)** Willful destruction of institution property.
  - (h) Creating ill will or intolerance on religious or communal grounds.
  - **(i)** Causing disruption in any manner of the academic functioning of the University system.
  - (j) Ragging as per ordinance XV-C.

- **(iv)** Without prejudice to the generality of his/her powers relating to the maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest of maintaining discipline as may seem to him/her appropriate, the Vice-Chancellor, may exercise his/her power aforesaid order or direct that any student or students
  - a) be expelled; or
  - b) Any student or students be, for a stated period, restricted; or
  - c) Be not, for a stated period, admitted to course of study in a college, department or institution of the University; or
  - d) Be fined with a sum of rupees that may be specified; or
  - e) Be debarred from taking a University or college or Departmental Examination or Examinations for one or more year; or; That the result of the student or students concerned in the Examination or Examinations in which he/she or they have appeared be cancelled.
- (v) The Principal, of the college, Heads of the halls, Deans of Faculties, heads of Teaching Departments in the University, the Principal School of Correspondent courses and Continuing Education and Librarian shall have the authority to exercise all such disciplinary powers over students in their respective College, Institution, Faculties and Teaching Departments in the University as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the Institution, Halls and teaching in the concerned Departments. They may exercise their authority through, or delegate authority to, teachers in their college, institutions or Departments as they may specify for the purposes.
- **(vi)** Without prejudice to the powers of the Vice-Chancellor and the Proctor as aforesaid, detailed rules of discipline and proper conduct shall be framed. These rules may be supplemented, where necessary, by the principals of College, heads of halls, Deans of Faculties and Heads of Teaching Departments in the University. Each student shall be expected to provide himself/herself with a copy of these rules.
- (vii) At the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration that on admission he/she submits himself/herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice-Chancellor and the several authorities of the University who may be vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Acts, the statutes, the ordinances and the Rules that have been framed there by the University.

#### **Ordinance XV-C**

#### 12. PROHIBITION AND PUNISHMENT FOR RAGGING

- (i) Ragging in any form strictly prohibited, within the premises of college/Department of Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
- (ii) Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this ordinance.
- (iii) Ragging for the purposes of this ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students and includes individual or collective acts or practices which:
  - (a) Involve physical assault or threat or use of Physical force.
  - **(b)** Violate the status, dignity and honor of woman students.
  - **(c)** Violate the status, dignity and honor of students belonging to the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes.
  - **(d)** Expose students to ridicule on contempt and affect their self-esteem.
  - **(e)** Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behavior.
- **(iv)** The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department of an Institution, the Authorities of College, of University Hostel or Halls or residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
- (v) Notwithstanding anything in clause (4) above, the Proctor may also Suo-moto, enquiry into any incident of ragging and makes a report to the Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of incident.
- **(vi)** The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and nature of the ragging incident.
- (vii) If the Principal of the college or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing it is not reasonable practical to hold such an enquiry, he/she may so advice the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
- **(viii)** When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry his/her decision shall be final.
- (ix) On the receipt of a report under clause (5) or (6) or a determination by a relevant authority under clause (7) disclosing occurrence of ragging incidence described in clause 3(a),(b)and 9(c), that the vice chancellor shall direct order rustication of a student or students for a specified number of years.

- (x) The vice chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period admitted to a course of study and result of the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be cancelled.
- (xi) In case where students who have obtained degree or diploma of Delhi University are found guilty under this ordinance, appropriate action will be taken understates 15 or withdrawal of degree or diploma conferred by the university.
- (xii) For the purpose of this ordinance abutment to ragging will amount to ragging.
- (xiii) All institutions within Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions/directions issued under this ordinance, and to give aid and assistance to the vice chancellor or achieve the effective implementation of the ordinance.

#### RAGGING IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED
